BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE Regional Conveyance Line

MSWD's new Regional Conveyance Line is one of three concurrent projects that will provide wastewater flows to the District's new Regional Water Reclamation facility. The Regional Conveyance Line project includes a force main from the existing Dos Palmas lift station at Dillon Road and Avenida Manzana to Little Morongo Road and Dillon Road. From there, a gravity line will bring flows down to the new plant.

More than 90 percent of the project's design is currently complete. Final design schismatics are pending final CVCC easements. We anticipate construction to start in Fall 2022 and to run through Fall 2023.

Project Benefits

The Regional Conveyance Line, coupled with the new Regional Water Reclamation Facility and Regional Collection System project will expand MSWD's service area and provide wastewater treatment to homes and businesses currently unable to receive service. Essential to protect our valuable groundwater supply, the new line will allow flows that currently travel to the District's Alan L. Horton Wastewater Treatment Plant to be diverted to the new facility, extending the operational life of the Horton plant by as much as 10 years.

General Budget

To minimize the financial impact of construction costs on our customers, MSWD has secured State grant funding to cover the \$68 million+ cost for the new Regional Water Reclamation facility and the Regional Conveyance Line and Collection System projects.
